Description

SlidingDors (dor = generation in Hebrew) is a 2-year program where American, Hungarian and Israeli second-generation Holocaust survivors can meet and discuss their unique Jewish identity. Through an integrated curriculum of in-person and online sessions, groups will have local programming in their own communities as well as online meetings with other groups from the P2G family.

Goals



Help the second generation from Israel, Budapest and USA to understand their own unique Jewish identity by sharing their memories with each other both locally and with their peers from other communities

Initiate dialogues between the second and third generation as well as international connections for the "empty nest" generation

Ensure the continuation of the Jewish value of storytelling

Measurable Objectives / Outcomes

- At least six international sessions throughout the year where groups from different P2G communities meet
- 2. Participants from at least ten P2G communities
- 3. At least two complementary projects in which participants/ communities may take part, such as: academic research, art exhibition, guest speakers who visit US communities on their Yom HaShoah event, trip to Israel and Budapest in 2022, special training for engaged participants who would like to share their stories publicly
